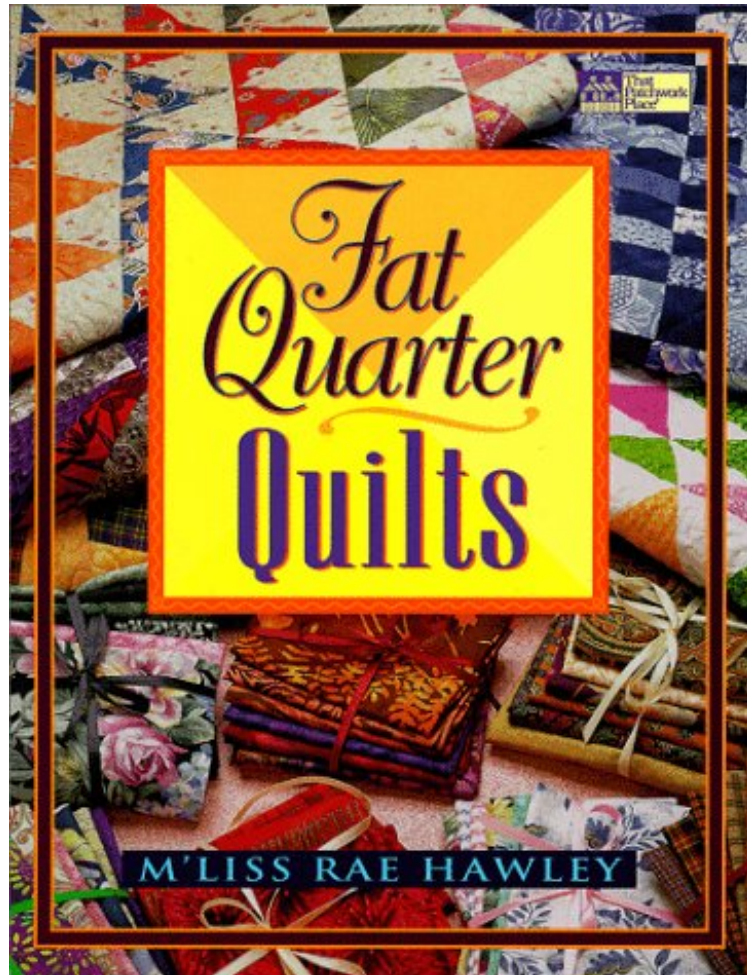

used on patios and looked beautiful so she wanted to do the same. I have bought enough fabric to do at least 3 of these for myself, mother and mother-in-law. I've started and it seems to be going together rather quickly. I also love the triangles pattern, but I think I'm going to wait until next summer when I have more time for piecing all of those triangles together. This book is one you'll want to have in your collection for sure. Even if you don't buy fat quarters you can buy 1/2 yard cuts and cut them in 1/2. Then you have enough to do 2 quilts or trade with someone else it's cheaper to buy your fabric that way too.
