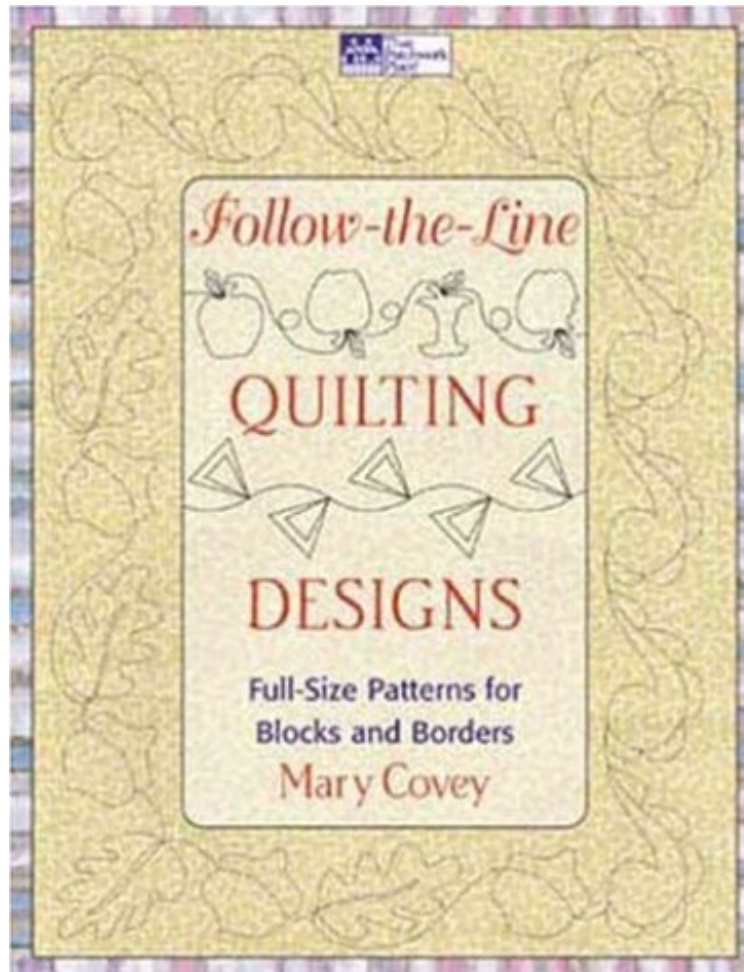

Unusual Format But I Like ItBy mythumpaI didn't read the description as well as I should have, so I was surprised to find that this was loose leaf pages with a booklet. I hole punched the pages and put them into a binder with the booklet for use; it would be very easy to lose some of the pages, or have them get dog-eared very quickly otherwise. That's the only real issue I had with the book; the format is very useful but awkward

to store. The designs are flexible and varied, and there's a border, corner, and block treatment for each one. They are loose leaf so can be easily traced, enlarged, or laid on your quilt as you work for reference. All my work is freehand, so I can put the design page on the top as I practice to learn it. Designs are varied, from a simple loopy heart to a buck, so there's something for all levels. I'd like to see more supporting designs, since it adds so much interest to the quilting when you quilt different areas with different but similar shapes. It's like using a buck in one place, and a doe with fawn or trees in another, or fish in one spot and water plants or a turtle in another. Variations and supporting designs add so much interest to a top, and they are missing here.
