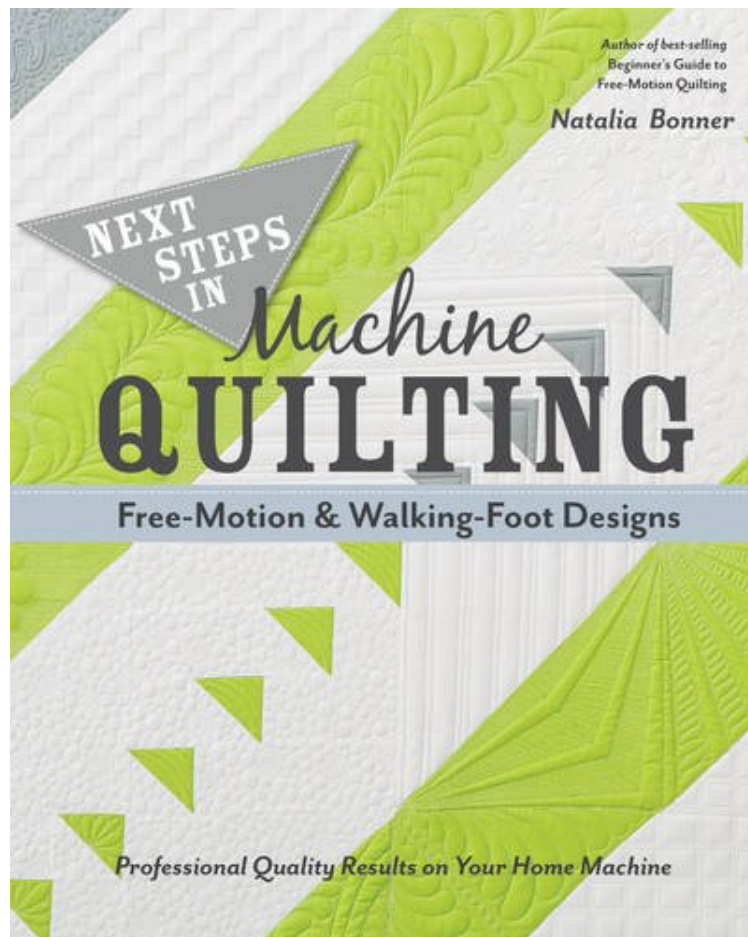

Achievable Results For Real PeopleBy SLSNext Steps in Machine Quilting is Natalia Bonner's follow-up to her Beginners Guide to Free-motion Quilting. It features lots of actual photos that (gasp) show fabric puckers, quilting line cross-overs, thread blips, and (gasp) (cough, cough) imperfectly spaced lines. You know, like how normal real quilters would do, i.e. those of us who need a book like Bonner's. The whole focus at the stage is to slow down, enjoy the process, and free your mind, hands, and imagination from the obsession with perfection.Beautiful close-ups show creative ways of blending tight, localized stitches with

long expanses of straight lines. You'll be changing your presser feet fairly often. Bonner even makes artwork out of a "simple" signature. The checkerboard effect she gets from minute stippling of every other square is quite nice. Time-consuming, but doable by us mere mortals who want to learn the craft without competing for first place. Tips are abundant and some are unusual. For example, Bonner uses 2 layers of batting to get that checkerboard/cross-hatching effect. She's also one of (psst) THOSE PEOPLE who muck about with that teeny screw on the bobbin case to get the threads and tension to play well together. If you are already quite experienced you might get a few imaginative ideas from the photos. Ideally, though, *Next Steps in Machine Quilting* is best suited for brave experienced beginners with growing pains. 2 of 2 people found the following review helpful.
