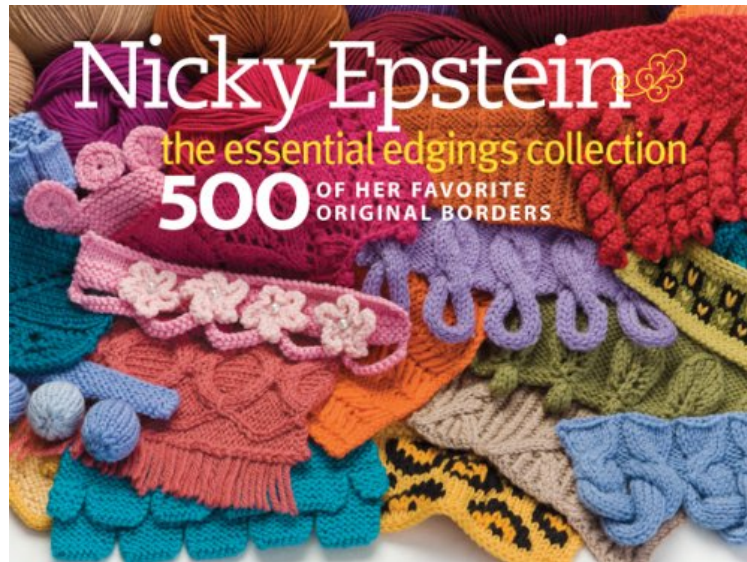

Few of the options are unique to edging per se, and she only shows one thing at a time. There are few examples of stacked edgings to see how one might layer them. Epstein also fails to give any clue as to how stretchy or loose a stitch might be. The photos are stunning, although the colors so garish that it's hard to visualize the stitches at times. Overall it's an attractive book, but less useful than I'd hoped. I'll probably give it as a gift rather than keeping it.
