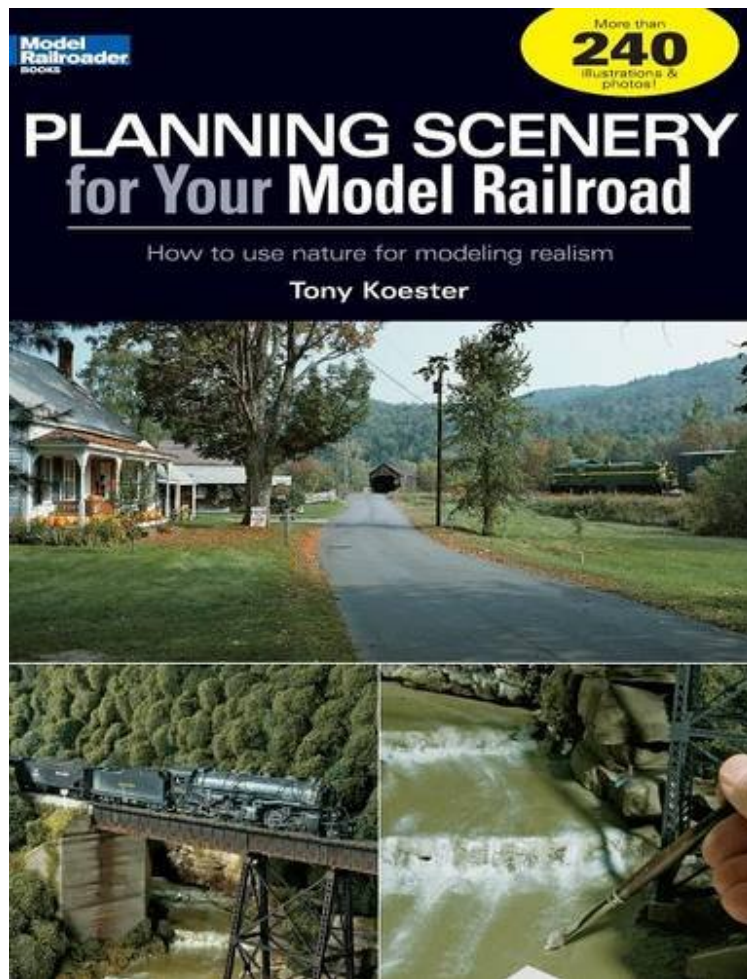

Not just another scenery manual By Philanthropic Pundit As the name of this title suggests, planning scenery is vital to establish a feel for any layout that you are attempting to build. Generally in the past you would construct a landscape and then populate it with structures and details and end up with a nice looking scene. But would that scene actually be consistent with what you are trying to model. This book looks and guides you through the process of determining the correct amount of prototype scenery that you need and by selectively compressing the scene, you will build a far more believable and context correct representation of the locale you are trying to model. The subject matter is often thought provoking enough to make you reconsider your direction and or make you look at some scenes again in a more analytical way. Whilst this book is not a compendium of modeling techniques or processes, it has a broad overview of the basics that you will need to consider.
