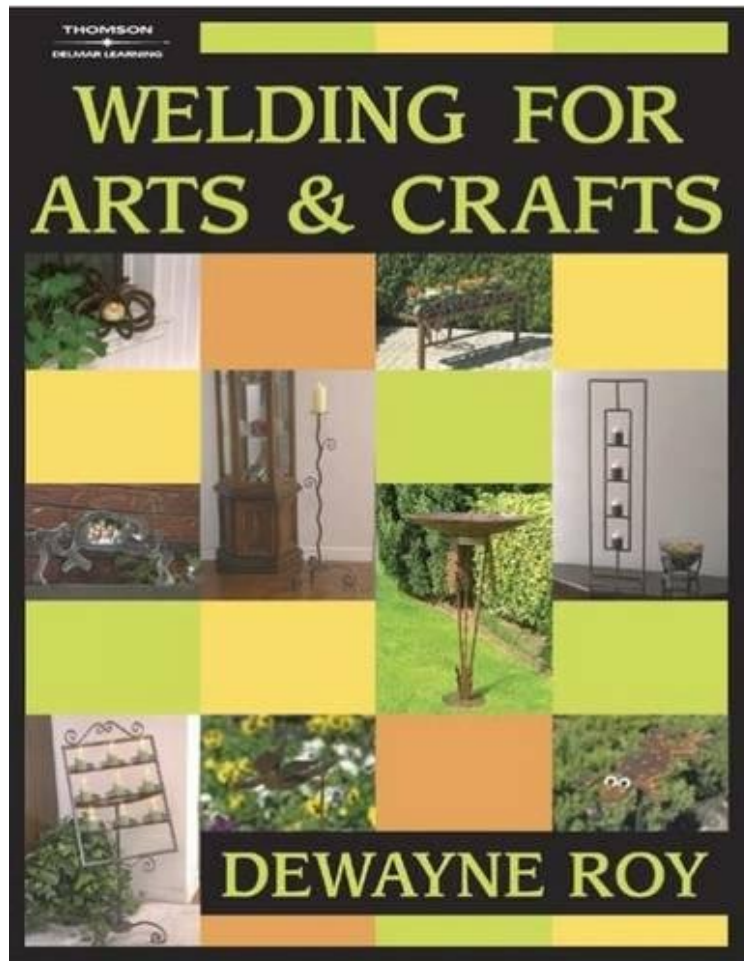

I wasn't expecting instructions (which this book doesn't really provide), but rather inspiration/concepts to checkout. So, I was quite disappointed when I opened the package and saw a small magazine style "book". The pictures are very poor - they are black and white with really terrible

shading, so you cannot see hardly any detail. When I say poor, I mean you can see the individual pixels on the pictures without even looking close.
