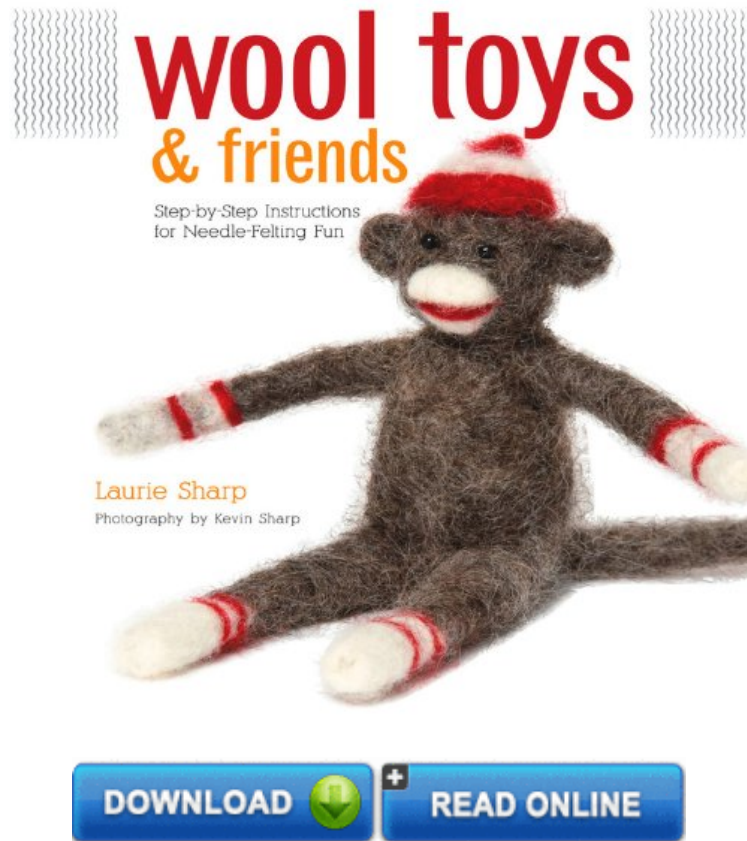

The clear, easy-to-follow directions are accompanied by photographs, so crafters can see what the project should look like at every step essential for three-dimensional projects such as these. Sharps technique, especially with faces, is painterly, and the attention to detail in the patterns is extraordinary.
