The animals in the book are really cute.The designs include patterns for the following: Anita the Cow, Bo the Panda, Carlos the Hummingbird, Manu and Brigitte the Dachshunds, Mortimer the Mammoth, Oswald the Owl, Txerri the Piglet, Bernard the Bear, Shawn the Shark, Rudy the Red Panda, Woo Ri the Lion, Cedric the Sloth, Alvin the Hedgehog, Kimi the Kitten, and Anna the Swan and her baby Peter.My grandson is enamored of the Kung Fu Panda, so I do both of the Pandas first. Each pattern is so cute, I know that I will want to make each of them at least once.There are really good instructions

included. I really appreciate that each pattern is marked with a skill level. I've been crocheting for decades but have only picked up amigurumi in the last five years. I consider myself an advanced crocheter but with intermediate skills with these little creatures. I look forward to the challenge of the more advanced patterns. The yarns for each design are listed but those are really just guidelines. I generally find a yarn that I like and stick to the brand throughout the series of projects I want to group together. If I just a different weight of yarn, it will have its effect on the hook size I use, the amount of yarn I use and the size of the finished project.
